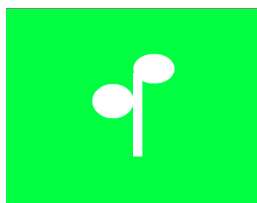

Chinese Calligraphy

In China, calligraphy occupies a distinguished position in the field of traditional art. It is not only a means of communication, but also a means of expressing a person's inner world in an aesthetic sense.

Ancient people paid great attention to calligraphy. It was the essential whereby a candidate could manifest his literary talent in the Imperial Examination, for it gave a first impression to the examiners. Children of high officials had to learn and try to write a good hand; even emperors themselves were good at calligraphy, for example, the versatile Emperor Qianlong in the Qing Dynasty (1644 – 1911) has left us many examples of his handwriting on steles in temples and palaces.

Four Treasures of the Study

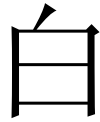
The writing brush, ink stick, paper and ink slab (stone) are the four traditional implements and materials for writing and painting in China. These four stationery items are called “Four Treasures of the Study” in China. Each of the four items is represented by its best, the Xuan Paper, Hui ink stick, Hu brush and Duan ink slab are highly valued by Chinese.

Once the brush movement hesitates, a black mark is created, so speed, strength and agility is the essence of fine artwork. When writing, many calligraphers will forget all worries and even themselves, combining all thoughts in the beauty of their art. Thus it can be compared with Qigong, which also can mold and improve a person's temper and promote well being.

Thanksgiving is a unique American holiday, but the idea of an annual celebration to thank God for his bounty stretches back in time and around the world.



Like many American cultural activities, the Thanksgiving holiday that originated in the United States is catching on in China -- slowly. It is mainly celebrated amongst Canadians and Americans who live in China, and by some teachers who teach about the holiday. But the kids and adults reinterpret the day to be a day for giving thanks to their parents, teachers, friends and other people.

In China, many North Americans like to have a Thanksgiving meal and invite their local friends and workmates. However, finding turkey is problematical in most cities unless there are foreign-oriented stores there. So people usually roast geese or chicken instead. In many of the best international hotels, turkey can often be found on Thanksgiving Day. New Chinese supermarkets in the big cities may also stock frozen turkey.
