
- Ray Chinese School will have a Chinese New Year celebration performance on Saturday, February 11th at Kennedy Jr. High School.

早means early or morning. It is the time of the day when the sun (\Box) has risen to the height of a man's helmet (\pm). \pm is the old form of \pm , originally meaning helmet. Since another meaning of \blacksquare is "first", the character \blacksquare signifies also the first (+) sun (\square) , that is the early morning: 早.

lantern Fe*r*tival

灯节or元宵节

The Lantern Festival falls on the 15th day of the 1st lunar month, usually in February or March in the Gregorian calendar. It is on Monday, February 6th for 2012. This day's important activity is watching lanterns. Lanterns of various shapes and sizes are hung in the streets, attracting countless visitors. Children will hold self-made or bought lanterns to stroll with on the streets, extremely excited. "Guessing lantern riddles" is an essential part of the Festival. Lantern owners write riddles on a piece of paper and post them on the lanterns. If visitors have solutions to the riddles, they can pull the paper out and go to the lantern owners to check their answer. If they are right, they will receive a small gift.

People will eat *yuanxiao*, or rice dumplings, on this day, so it is also called the "*Yuanxiao* Festival." *Yuanxiao* also has another name, *tangyuan*. It is small dumpling balls made of glutinous rice flour with rose petals, sesame, bean paste, jujube paste, walnut meat, dried fruit, sugar and edible oil as filling. *Tangyuan* can be boiled, fried or steamed. It tastes sweet and delicious. What's more, *tangyuan* in Chinese has a similar pronunciation with "*tuanyuan*", meaning reunion. So people eat them to denote union, harmony and happiness for the family. In the daytime of the Festival, performances such as a dragon lantern dance, a lion dance, a land boat dance, a *yangge* dance, walking on stilts and

beating drums while dancing will be staged. In the night, except for magnificent lanterns, fireworks form a beautiful scene. Most families spare some fireworks from the Spring Festival and let them off in the Lantern Festival. Some local governments will even organize a fireworks party. On the night when the first full moon enters the New Year, people become really intoxicated by the imposing fireworks and bright moon in the sky.
