Winter solstice 2012 is on December 21. It is the shortest day of the year in the northern hemisphere and the longest day in the southern. In Chinese philosophy, Yin symbolizes the feminine and negative qualities of the universe while Yang the masculine and positive. It is dialectical and dynamic in a sense. When something has reached one extreme, it will turn to the opposite. On the day of the winter solstice, the Yin is at its peak with the longest night. From then on, it will give way to the light

and warmth of Yang. And the Chinese consider it a right time for optimism and joy. Winter solstice is the natural transition between Yin and Yang, so this day was considered as a blessing from 'above'. In China, winter solstice celebrations started 2000 years ago. It was a day to worship heaven and the ancestors. On that day, emperors held one of the most important ceremonies in Temple of Heaven during

Ming and Qing dynasties. The ceremony had to be perfectly completed. A small mistake would constitute a bad omen for the whole nation in the coming year.

Like any other holiday celebrations, there must be delicious food to be prepared. On the day of winter solstice, people from northern China more commonly to have dumplings, 'wonton soup' and lamb, while people from southern China have 'tang-yuan' and 'hong dou nuo mi fan' (red bean and sticky rice). These foods are not only taste good, but also helping warming up the body, and building up enough energy for winter.
